Creedence Clearwater Revival
Recreated by Green River
with the classic sounds of its founder John Fogerty

*Popular east coast band performs
90 minutes of classic CCR and Fogerty solo hits*

June 29, 2010, Dix Hills, New York – The Dix Hills Performing Arts Center will present Long Island's top Creedence Clearwater Revival homage, The Green River Tribute Band, July 31 at 7:30 p.m. Tickets are \$25.

Green River is named for Creedence's third album released in 1969, reaching the top of *Billboard's* Pop Album charts. The band's second platinum album, which later achieved multi-platinum status, contained the band's classic hit "Bad Moon Rising," as well as the classic title track "Green River."

The Green River Tribute Band, a long-time fixture on the east coast music scene, is led by Rick "Noodles" Horvath, an original member of "Sorethumb," one of Long Island's most successful working bands. Rich was musical director for Rick Virga & All The King's Men, one of the region's top Elvis bands, which performed on Broadway. Horvath also worked with some of rock's top studio producers and engineers, including Mick Jones of Foreigner, Gary Lyons and Steve Rinkoff.

Rick began singing Creedence Clearwater Revival songs in his very first band at the age of 13. The Green River Tribute Band is his brainchild.

Very faithful to a live CCR performance for aficionados and fans, the band plays all of CCR's most famous hits "Bad Moon Rising," "Proud Mary," "Up Around The Bend," etc. Mirroring Credence founder John Fogarty's personal evolution, Green River performs a costume change between sets and returns to play many of Fogarty's most popular solo classics, including "The Old Man Down the Road" and "Centerfield," among others.

In addition to the CCR and Fogerty classics that still receive frequent airplay, The Green River Tribute Band lends its own interpretation to some of CCR's extended jams, such as "Born on the Bayou" and "Susie Q," faithfully capturing the intensity of the original jams.
