**Dix Hills, New York, May 25, 2010** – The Dix Hills Performing Arts Center will present Long Island’s own -- and one of the most revered -- Bon Jovi tribute bands, “Bad Medicine” July 9 at 7:30 pm at the Center. Tickets are \$25.

Bad Medicine, named for Bon Jovi’s hardest rocking song, faithfully recreates the sound of Bon Jovi and legendary stage presence of leader Jon Bon Jovi. The original New Jersey band went global after getting local airplay for “Runaway” on the former WAPP-FM, then went platinum with a string of hits from “Living on a Prayer” and “You Give Love a Bad Name” and “Dead or Alive,” to name just a few.

The tribute band Bad Medicine has also made its mark on the music business. Its members have spent the last seven years establishing Bad Medicine as one of the most sought-after tribute shows in the nation, and hold a candle to no other

Bon Jovi tribute. In fact, Bad Medicine is the only tribute band hired by Jon Bon Jovi's own Philadelphia Soul Arena Football team, and was also hired to play Bon Jovi fan club events around the country (run by Jon's family).

Wrote Kelly-Jane Cotter of New Jersey's Asbury Park Press newspaper: "Steve Sage bears an uncanny resemblance to Jon Bon Jovi. His bandmates look like themselves, but they sound very much like the band that started in Sayreville and went on to bring arena rock to the masses."

Performing around the country in some of the nation's most revered venues such as the House Of Blues, B.B. King's and The Hard Rock Cafe, Bad Medicine continues to hold audiences captive with its live antics and driving music.

The band is comprised of five top-tier musicians whose shared musical histories include Thin Lizzy, Dio, Great White and Brett Michaels, among other top-name acts. This includes vocalist Steve Sage, guitarist Steve Frangadakis, bassist Randy Gregg, keyboardist John Pincus and drummer Joey Anderson.

Incredible musicianship and vocal talents blended together with Steve Sage's uncanny resemblance to John Bon Jovi make Bad Medicine one of the top Bon Jovi Tribute bands around today.
